



Welcome to the Giraffes' Classroom

Your child is ready to begin the transition process from the Two's Class to the Giraffes. The Two's Teachers and the Directors have observed positive developmental changes in your child and we are confident that he or she will be successful in the next classroom. The Giraffes' Early Preschool class is a gateway class from the Two's class to the Polar Bears & Penguins' Preschool classroom. This classroom is for our 2.5 year olds and young 3s who are ready to be in a 3 year old setting but require additional assistance with potty training.

How will the transition process work?

The transition process typically lasts for one week with the goal of having your child adjusted to his or her new teachers, setting, routines, schedule, and the ways things are done in the new class by the full time start date in their new class. This goal is achieved by having your child spend a portion of his or her day in the new setting. The children are usually dropped off in their classroom and have breakfast there. Typically, the Giraffes teachers transition their new preschoolers into their classroom between 9:30 am and 12:30 pm. The transitioning times are very flexible depending upon the needs of the children and the center. The main idea is that the children spend time each day in their new classroom to become acclimated to all aspects of the new environment. They will spend the latter part of the day with their new class towards the end of the week, as they are comfortable. This is done so that your child can gradually adapt to their new classroom's daily routines and schedules for both times of the day.

A Brief Introduction to the Giraffes' Classroom

The goal of Bright Start Preschool is to have the children learn to try, experience success, develop confidence within themselves and others, and obtain an intrinsic motivation to learn.

Our preschool program is highly focused, offering an ever-growing child-centered learning environment with multiple opportunities for children to experience new and familiar activities. The children are encouraged to make choices, experiment with ideas, problem solve, and develop other important skills. The Giraffes' class prepares children for a more formal class setting and starts to set the stage for kindergarten readiness.

Circle Time

Similar to our other classes, our Giraffes enjoy circle time. The circle times last a little longer than in earlier classrooms and include a larger range of activities that are more appropriate for this age group. The children not only sing songs and listen to stories, but they also are given the opportunity to speak in front of the group to share ideas and experiences and to make connections. This type of activity will aid in their development of confidence and comfort with using language to effectively communicate with others.

Small Groups & Centers

Learning centers are available to small groups of children to facilitate basic preschool skills. These learning centers also provide students with the building blocks of social interaction and interpersonal communication. Some of the learning centers of study are:

- ✓ **Literacy-** A time for children to begin to facilitate pre-phonics and letter recognition skills.
- ✓ **Math-** Developing an understanding of counting, patterning, one-to-one correspondence, beginning sequencing, and shape comparison and identification.
- ✓ **Science-** Exposure to various items in the preschool environment on a sensory level; as well as gaining an understanding of the surrounding world with a focus on the needs and characteristics of items in nature.
- ✓ **Art-** Students are given a variety of art media, as well as many different styles of art to work with and develop confidence and pride in their own works of art.
- ✓ **Fine Motor Development-** Using items such as play-dough, scissors, and puzzles; students develop muscles essential to writing skills and fine motor enhancement.
- ✓ **Gross Motor Development-** Developing coordination within the classroom setting in the areas like basic balance, running, catch, etc. in a safe and nurturing environment.

Giraffes participate in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), Computers (during the fall, winter, and spring) and Spanish enrichment activities. Each Friday morning, they participate in Music for Life class. Children in this classroom also enjoy extra curricular activities offered throughout the seasons.

What All Parents Need to Know

Licensing requires that:


- We maintain one teacher for every eight children (8:1) for children in our preschool, unless all children are 3 years old then it is one teacher for every ten children (10:1).
- Children do NOT need to be fully potty trained to be enrolled in our preschool.
- All food/drinks must be labeled with the child's name and date. Please help us by labeling your child's food/drinks before you place it in the cubby.

We also need your help with the following:

- If your child plans to eat the school lunch, please notify us by 11:30 am if your child is going to be late so that we can reserve a portion for your child. If we are not informed by 11:30 am, then we cannot guarantee that your child will be eating the same thing that is listed on the school menu.
- If you check your child out from the center and plan to return later, please notify us as you leave so that we can make appropriate staffing arrangements and/or lunch/snack preparation arrangements.
- Please keep us updated with any changes to your child's allergies or other medical conditions that might affect him/her while in our care.
- Please help us by providing a change of clothes to be kept in your child's cubby.
- Please do not place any sunscreen (topical creams), or medications in your child's cubby. Give these items to your child's teachers.
- We are not responsible for personal items such as necklaces, hair clips, silly bands, bracelets, etc.
- Have your child bring only 1 item for "Show and Share" related to either our "Letter of the Week" or the theme for the week.

What to Bring on the First Day

- ✓ At least two changes of clothing, including socks
- ✓ Sunscreen
- ✓ A small photo of your child (for his/her cubby)
- ✓ A family photo
- ✓ A stuffed animal (to help your child feel comfortable), which will be allowed for his/her first few weeks and during nap/ rest time.

Parent Teacher Conferences

At Bright Start Learning Center we are focused on providing your child with not only high quality child care, but with valuable learning experiences that will positively impact your child's future performance in school. As part of our efforts to establish a great rapport with our parents and ensuring your child's success in our center, we hold two parent teacher conferences a year, fall and spring. In the parent teacher conference, teachers will inform parents about their child's social, emotional, physical, and cognitive development. The purpose of the conference is for teachers to share information about the child's strengths and core areas the child is excelling in. Of course, if a teacher has a concern it will be communicated and the two together, parent and teacher, will discuss the steps that have been taken or will be taken to help the child in the specific developmental domain or skill area. This is also an opportunity for parents to raise concerns or ask whatever questions they may have.



Bright Start Policy Reminders

It is important that our parents are always mindful of some key policies and therefore ask that you review the ones below at this time.

Food Allergy Safe Policy

To protect all of the children at the Center, we do not allow homemade food to be served to children other than your own. In addition, all food brought to the center must comply with our food allergy policy, even if it will only be eaten by your own child. In accordance with our policy, food must be labeled "school-safe" or it must be on our approved list of snacks and treats. Specifically,

- Food labels that say "May contain peanuts or tree nuts" are **NOT OK**.

- Food labels that say "Made on equipment that also processes peanuts or tree nuts" are **NOT OK.**
- Food labels that say "Made in a facility that also processes peanuts or tree nuts" are **NOT OK.**

Our safe snack list is available on our website. Please print it and have it as a ready resource. If you are sending food in of any kind, you MUST give it to the lead teacher and she will check it. DO NOT put food in your child's cubby or leave in his or her backpack. DO NOT allow your child to come into school with partially-eaten food in his or her hand.

Also, it is very important that your child wash his or her hands immediately upon arrival. Not only is this a good step to help prevent the spread of germs, it helps to minimize the risk of cross contamination if your child has been in contact with foods that may be allergens for other children.

Illness Notifications

If your child is diagnosed with a contagious illness, you must notify the office by phone call or email as soon as possible. It is not enough to notify the classroom via Brightwheel. We are required by our licensing regulations to post notices of such illnesses so that other parents are aware. In order to do this, we must have accurate and timely information from you. Also, please be mindful that your child must be fever free for at least 24 hours (without medication) before he or she can return to school. This helps to minimize spreading contagious illnesses.

Late Pick Ups

Bright Start closes at 6:30 pm. An on-time pick-up means that you have exited the building with your child by 6:30 not running in the door at 6:30 or lingering in the classrooms or Center beyond 6:30. Late pick-ups cause hardships for the staff that are not able to leave on time, and for the children, who have had a long day at school. While many parents believe that an occasional late pick-up is acceptable, one must remember that we have over 100 families enrolled. Late pick-ups are not acceptable, and Bright Start must enforce a strict policy to discourage such behavior. Accordingly, in addition to a late fee, if you (i) pick your child up more than 15 minutes late or (ii) if you have picked your child up late more than one time in a calendar year (even if late by less than 15 minutes), you will lose care for the day immediately following the respective late pick-up. Continuing issues with on time pickups will be addressed on a case-by-case basis. Solutions will include adjusting the family's required pickup time to no later than 6:00 permanently or disenrollment.
